## CHILD ABDUCTION FIRST RESPONDING OFFICER CHECKLIST

## **RESPOND**

RESPOND to ANY disappearance of a child as an Abduction Case until further information is developed. CHILD ABDUCTION BY A FAMILY MEMBER must be treated as an urgent missing child investigation. ALWAYS consider the child endangered until proven otherwise.

WITHOUT DELAY BROADCAST SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION TO: All police communication channels, other patrol officers, other law enforcement agencies, and consider AMBER ALERT

	Interview parent(s)/guardian(s)/person who made the initial report			
П	Verify child is missing			
	Missing child's name/biographical info/monikers/nicknames			
	Description of child/photo			
	Identify the circumstances/type of disappearance			
	Perform a thorough and detailed search of the child's residence			
	Determine when, where, and by whom the missing child was last seen			
	Interview the individuals who last had contact with the child			
	Make an initial assessment based on the available information. The type of incident: whether nonfamily abduction; family abduction; runaway; lost; injured; otherwise missing; or a child with special needs. Children on the autism spectrum are at high risk and may be drawn to water. Immediately call for additional responders, search nearby bodies of water and notify a supervisor.			
	Enter information into (MUPS/NCIC)			
	PIO, press release, county alert system, social media blast, media relationships			
INVESTIGATION				
	Establish and secure the crime scene			
	Obtain a detailed description of the missing child, abductor, and any vehicles used			
	Obtain photos and videos of the missing child (and the abductor if known). Be sure to ask about photos on cell phones/mobile devices			
	<ul> <li>Evaluate whether the circumstances meet:</li> <li>AMBER Alert criteria and/or other immediate community notification</li> </ul>

	Inquire if the child has access to the internet and evaluate its potential role, do not overlook activity on social media accounts or other online apps and platforms
